Results of a spider foray led by Edward Milner BSc, MIEEM, London Natural History Society Recorder Spiders

<i>Tegenaria gigantea</i>	Cob web spider	Giant house spider. Spins a sheet like web. Found in log pile
<i>Tegenaria domestica</i> juveniles	Common House spider	
<i>Zygiella x-notata</i>	Silver-sided sector spider	Spins an orb web with a section missing
<i>Metellina segmentata</i>	Lesser Garden Spider	Small orb-web
<i>Harpactea hombergi</i>	Stripe-legged Spider	Orange and brown cigar-shaped spider with striped legs
<i>Dysdera crocata</i> (juveniles)	Woodlouse spider	
<i>Clubiona corticalis</i>	Mouse spider	Mouse spider with faint chevrons. Found in bark or dead leaves
<i>Clubiona terrestris</i>	Mouse spider	Found in dead leaves
<i>Amaurobius similis</i>	Lace weaver spider	Blue web spider with pale yellowish pattern. Funnel webs of lacy, fluffy silk. Likes to build its home in holes in fences
<i>Amaurobius ferox</i>	Black lace weaver spider	Dark, larger blue-web spider
<i>Pholcus phalangioides</i>	Daddy-long-legs spider	
<i>Lepthyphantes minutus</i>	Money spider	Dark bars on the legs
<i>Lepthyphantes tenuis</i>	Money spider	Very small dark coloured.
<i>Theridion mystaceum</i>		tiny tangle-web spider on railings
<i>Diplocephalus</i> sp.	Money spider	
<i>Pardos</i> sp.	Wolf spider
